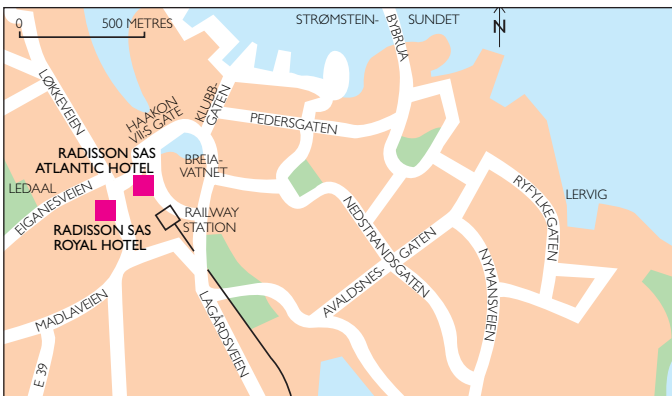

- Stavanger attained township status in 1125 when Bishop Reinald arrived with a throng of English craftsmen, announcing he was going to build a cathedral. Today, Stavanger is a dynamic trade and business city with a population of 120 000, and a varied cultural life.
- After oil was discovered in the Ekofisk field in the North Sea in 1966, Stavanger experienced a new wave of prosperity and quickly developed a high-tech industry. The different chapters in this history can today be viewed in the unique and modern oil museum in downtown Stavanger.
- For a taste of the past, stroll down the streets of Old Stavanger, where proud residents have restored their old wooden houses. Within a short boatride you will find the amazing Lysefjord with its famous Pulpit Rock towering 600 meters above sea level. Other highlights includes the Kjerag Mountains and the sandy beaches of Jæren - all waiting to be explored.
